Ms. Pam Miller was present on behalf of the petition.

**Ms. Sara Farr** gave the staff report. The petitioner requested to erect a 24 inch by 36 inch marker in Reynolds Circle or the "Historic Kensington Park Est. 1952." This petition was reviewed by the HSMC on March 5, 2015 and April 2, 2015. The petition was continued at both meetings to allow for the petitioner to provide the following information: justification for the new markers due to existing plaques on the brick piers, details for the mounting of the signs and the durability of the sign materials and the selection of a new site for the marker. The application was revised as follows: removal of the smaller signs located on the brick piers and specifying that the sign will be constructed or etched wood instead of a flat painted surface and that it will be mounted two feet off the ground with woods posts embedded in the ground. Two new sites are also proposed: the triangle at the intersection of Althea Parkway and Reynolds Street and Reynolds Circle. The preferred site is Reynolds Circle.

**Ms. Farr** reported that staff recommends approval to City Council of the Reynolds Circle location with the following conditions:

- 1. The sign is located 10 feet from back of curb per Traffic Engineering;
- 2. An encroachment license is obtained via Real Properties.

#### PETITIONER COMMENTS

**Ms. Miller** thanked the staff and HSMC for working with their neighborhood to get their marker erected. As staff has reported, the neighborhood prefers that the marker be put in the Reynolds Circle location. The new site is central to the neighborhood. They held their neighborhood celebration here in this area two weeks.

# NOTE: Mr. Kristopher Monroe recused from participating in this request as he is the President of the Board of Art Rise Savannah.

Ms. Erin Wessling was present on behalf of the petition.

Ms. Sara Farr gave the staff report. The petitioner is requesting a temporary mural at 347

Abercorn Street. Judge Realty is holding a contest for a temporary moss mural on their building. The mural will be completed with Art Rise Savannah to celebrate the community and the environment. The mural will take approximately five to seven days to install and grow and the final design will last nine to fifteen days before being removed from the building.

**Ms. Farr** reported that staff recommends approval of the mural with the following conditions:

- 1. It is removed in accordance with the Preservation Brief 1;
- 2. The final design is approved by the HSMC;

Because otherwise it meets the standards in the Master Plan and Guidelines for Markers, Monuments, and Public Art.

**Ms. Wessling** explained how the moss will be applied to the building. She said the moss is sustainable and, therefore, will not harm the building. The moss will go from the top of the building to the bottom. No words will be placed on the building. There will only be images.

**Ms. Harris** reported that this petition was presented to staff on April 22, 2015. The petitioner was requesting a temporary mural at 1704 Lincoln Street. The mural was being proposed to be installed with chalk spray paint April 30, 2015 and removed May 2, 2015. Ms. Harris stated that due to the timeframe, there was not enough time to present this to the HSMC. Therefore, she contacted Chairman Karatassos and explained the situation to him. He directed that this be handled at staff level. The temporary mural includes a floral pattern at the doorway and sidewalk at 1704 Lincoln Street. The chalk can be removed with water and a brush. The public notice standards were waived due to the temporary nature of the mural.

**Ms. Harris** reported that staff approved the public art because it met the standards in the Master Plan and Guidelines for Markers, Monuments and Public Art.

**Ms. Harris** stated that the HSMC might want to come up with a guideline for staff to approve items such as this.

#### HSMC DISCUSSION

The HSMC believed the item was handled appropriately.

#### 6. <u>Commissioner Items</u>

**Mr. Ryan Madson** reported that a light projection on the SunTrust Bank Building was done by Jason Armstrong. This was not brought to the HSMC, but he believes it was approved by the City.

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Ms. Harris stated that she is not sure this was approved by the City.

**Mr. Harper** stated that when he saw the lights on the building, he called staff and inquired about this.

**Ms. Rahn** asked if the light installation such as this falls under the authorization of the HSMC.

**Ms. Harris** explained that this falls under the authorization of the HSMC as the Public Arts Guidelines applies to this matter.
