Ms. Ashley Helmholdt was present on behalf of the petition.

Ms. Farr gave the staff report. The mural was approved temporarily at the August 6, 2015 meeting in order for the mural to be installed in time for a community event. The mural is completed. It is mounted on plywood near the fence and is located in a community garden. The mural was designed by students in the Savannah Ambassadors Program coordinated with the City of Savannah's Community Planning and Development Department. The mural's title is "Blue Sky Garden Mural." The size of the mural is 4 feet by 12 feet. As the mural was temporarily approved by the HSMC if it is not approved today, it will be removed.

Ms. Farr stated that staff received two public comments in favor of the mural. They were from 124 and 126 East 39th Street. The owner of 201 East 38th Street and 2210 Abercorn Street was not in favor of the mural. Ms. Farr said favorable comments were received from some of the members of the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC).

Ms. Farr reported that staff recommends approval of the mural because it meets the standards in the Master Plan and Guidelines for Markers, Monuments, and Public Art.

Mr. Harper asked staff what was the objection to the mural.

Ms. Farr explained that the objection was the mural being placed in a residential area.

Ms. Loretto Lominack and Sis. Helen Marie were on behalf of the petition.

Ms. Sara Farr gave the staff report. The petitioner is requesting approval for Part I: theme, location and preliminary design, to erect a monument recognizing the contributions of the Sisters of Mercy and the Convent of St. Vincent de Paul of the Savannah community. It will be located at 207 East Liberty Street. The monument will consist of a nun and a student dressed in the school's uniform on a 3 foot by 4 inch by 5 foot base. It will be feet 8 inches tall at the highest point. The base will be granite and the statue will be bronze. It is one of a collection of six statues with a similar design, but the student's uniform will be specific to St. Vincent de Paul's school. The monument is proposed to be located near an existing historical marker on the property at 207 East Liberty Street. It will be easily visible from the public right-of-way in the tree lawn, but will not obstruct traffic.

Ms. Farr stated that as required, written notices was sent to all property owners, and the neighborhood association, within 200 feet of the subject property. A sign was posted on the property fifteen days prior to the meeting. The Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) commented on this monument.

Ms. Farr reported that staff recommends approval for Part I: theme and location for a monument at 207 East Liberty Street because the proposed project meets the standards in the Master Plan and the Guidelines for Markers, Monuments, and Public Art. Part II: Final Design and Funding will need to come before the Board for approval.

Mr. Karatassos asked staff if Traffic Engineering and Park & Tree are in agreement with the location of the monument.

Ms. Farr answered yes.

Ms. Lominack explained that they are really excited about the monument. The Sisters of Mercy have done an amazing amount of good work for the City of Savannah. They thank the HSMC for considering their monument.
