#### Call to Order

Mr. Rick Winger, as designated Chairman in the absence of Chairman Pete Liakakis, called the July 11, 2007 special meeting of the Policy Committee to order.

#### I. Approval of Agenda

It was moved and seconded to approve the agenda as presented.

#### Policy Committee Action: the motion to approve the agenda of the July 11, 2007 Policy Committee meeting carried with none opposed.

#### II. <u>Action Item</u>

#### A. Review and Approval of the FY 2008 Unified Planning Work Program

Mr. Mark Wilkes made a brief presentation of the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). He outlined where the sources of funds the how the MPO uses it. The uses are as follows:

٠	Administration	12%
٠	Annual Planning Documents	5%
٠	Public Outreach	4%
٠	Commodities	3%
٠	Planning & Analysis	76%

Funding comes from Federal sources, state sources, and local sources totaling \$1,085, 277.50.

The question was asked if the local funds come from the general budget of the city and county or from SPLOST funds. Most of the time, the funds come from the general budget. SPLOST funds cannot be used for planning.

Special Tasks in the FY 2008 UPWP include the following:

- Traffic Impact Analysis Process about 80% complete at this time
- SW Sector Plan underway
- 2030 LRTP Financial Plan Update a SAFETEA-LU requirement to be completed by December 2007
- 2035 LRTP Full Update new task for 2008

Mr. Wilkes concluded his presentation by outlining the on-going tasks. Following his presentation the meeting was opened for questions.

Mr. Winger asked how often the LRTP was updated. Mr. Wilkes and Mr. Thomson explained that the LRTP is revised every five years. The last one was updated in 2004. The goal is to have the updated LRTP ready by 2009.

It was moved and seconded to approve the FY 2008 Unified Planning Work Program.

# Policy Committee Action: the motion to approve the FY 2008 Unified Planning Work Program carried with none opposed.

# III. Other Business

Mr. Thomson invited anyone to stay to meet with GDOT to talk about work area projects.

# IV. Other Public Comments

There were no other public comments offered at this time.

# V. Adjournment

There being no other business to come before the Committee, the July 11, 2007 special meeting of the Policy Committee was adjourned.
