


- Responsible for the preservation Savannah's historic resources.
- Staff reviews and approves Certificate of Appropriateness (COAs) for exterior building changes within Local Historic Districts and other Historic Properties through Chatham County and Savannah.
- Staff multiple MPC Commissions and Boards, coordinate historic resource identification, assists in drafting National Register nominations, draft ordinances.
- Performs Section 106 Reviews for the City's Housing Departments.

SAGIS

- SAGIS is a cooperative enterprise Geographic Information System between Chatham County, City of Savannah, and the Metropolitan Planning Commission, along with other regional jurisdictions.
- Consolidates GIS database administration, data distribution, and data sharing under one department, providing a cost share to Chatham County and the City of Savannah for the applications, hardware, and professional expertise.
- Supports Public Safety GIS by leading the GIS and Mapping Subcommittee for the E911 Advisory Board and providing GIS data editing, administration, and analysis for 911 Dispatch.





- Since the 1980's, the MPC has been the entity overseeing the update and submittal of Comprehensive Plans throughout the County.
- Last full update of each City's Comp Plan was done between 2006 and 2008 with minor amendments approved in 2016.
- We are updating Comprehensive Plans for Unincorporated Chatham County, Garden City, Pooler, and the City of Savannah.



What is a comp plan?



A **Comprehensive Plan** presents a **vision for the future**, with long-range goals and objectives for all activities that affect the local government such as Transportation, Landuse, Historic Preservation and Natural Resources.

Most plans are written to provide direction for future activities over a 10-to 20 year period after plan adoption. However, plans should receive a review and possible update every five years.



- Comprehensive Plan process is overseen by the Georgia Department of Community Affairs (DCA).
- Each local government must prepare, adopt, maintain, and implement an approved comprehensive plan as specified in the State of Georgia's standards to maintain "Qualified Local Government" (QLG) status.
- QLG status allows cities and counties access to financial resources to aid in implementing their plans (ex: CDBG, GEFA, ClG, water/sewer loans, OneGeorgia Authority funds, etc.).

Plan Implementation

Goals and strategies are the framework for the policy directions established in the Plan.

- "Goals" are general overarching, broad statements describing the direction that a community wants to go.
- "Strategies" are statements with actions that should be taken, identifying how much, who and when the action should occur.

Together, the overarching **goals** are achieved by implementing the **strategies** within the Comprehensive Plan


