FEBRUARY 2020 CALL FOR PROJECTS

The Coastal Region Metropolitan Planning Organization (CORE MPO) is conducting a competitive project selection process to award allocated FY 2018 and 2019 Highway Infrastructure Program (HIP) funds, provided through the federal apportionments.

- Expected Available Funds:
 - FY 2018 HIP Funds = \$926,709 (federal portion) obligation deadline: September 30, 2021
 - FY 2019 HIP Funds = \$1,305,713 (federal portion) obligation deadline: September 30, 2022
- Maximum Award:
 - FY 2018 HIP Funds = \$926,709 (federal portion)
 - FY 2019 HIP Funds = \$1,305,713 (federal portion)
- Minimum Award = \$200,000 (federal portion)
- At least 20% of the eligible costs of the proposed project must be locally funded. (Previously incurred costs cannot be counted as part of the 20% match for the newly awarded federal funds. If the funds are used on interstates, it is a 90/10 match, and the funds are covered at 100% for certain safety projects.)

An applicant may request a minimum of *at least \$200,000 of federal funds*. The federal funding request in this application can represent no more than 80% of the total cost of the applicant's proposal for most projects. For example, if an applicant requests \$1,000,000, and provides no more than the required 20% local match, he/she would be submitting a proposal totaling \$1,250,000.

Federal Requirements

Applicants should keep in mind that using the HIP funds involve adherence to federal requirements, as applicable, such as the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), prevailing wage rates (Davis-Bacon), Buy America, competitive bidding, and other contracting requirements, regardless of whether the projects are located within the right-of-way of a Federal-aid highway.

Projects funded through this selection process must be located within the CORE MPO's Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) boundary.

The CORE MPO - administered HIP funds can only be spent within the MPO's Metropolitan Planning Area which includes all of Chatham County, the portion of Effingham County and Bryan County located within the Savannah Urbanized Area, as well as Richmond Hill.

 Projects, if awarded funds, will be programmed in FY 2020 or FY 2021 or FY 2022 in the CORE MPO's FY 2018 – 2021 Transportation Improvement Program (July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2021) or in FY 2021 – 2024 TIP (July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2024).

Once the project is programmed in the TIP and the awarded federal funding is authorized in the programmed fiscal year, the funds must be obligated within two years, otherwise the funds will lapse.

failing levels of service and higher crash rates by 2030 according to a study recently completed by VHB for the MPO. Three alternatives were compared and the Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) was found to be the best option. All three alternatives include widening or replacement of the existing bridge over I-16.

The project would begin with an Interchange Modification Report (IMR) for submittal to GDOT and FHWA, which will include a review to verify the DDI is the preferred alternative. Once the IMR is approved a concept report will be completed with design and construction plans to follow.

The proposed project will improve the existing interchange to mitigate future expected congestion due to additional traffic. The interchange of I-16 and State Route 17/Little Neck Road currently functions as a conventional diamond rural interchange consisting of two stop-controlled intersections at the ramps. State Route 17/ Little Neck Road is a two lane undivided minor arterial that carries less than 6,000 vehicles per day. This will change with the completion of the Jimmy Deloach Parkway Extension Project in 2021. This interchange will serve as the terminus of the Jimmy Deloach Parkway, which is currently widening SR 17 from two lanes to four north of the interchange. When complete, the Jimmy Deloach Parkway will provide a direct alternative route between the Savannah Port and I-16. Current and expected future growth in the area will also increase traffic volumes here.

The project will also improve safety at the interchange which currently has crash rates above the statewide average on State Route 17/ Little Neck Road. The proposed alternatives are anticipated to reduce the overall number and intensity of crashes at the interchange.

The project will improve regional connectivity by facilitating more efficient flow of local, commuter and commercial truck traffic between I-16, Jimmy Deloach Parkway to the north and Little Neck Road to the south. This will benefit the Port, Chatham County and local municipalites as well as create better access to employment opportunities for people in the area.

The proposed interchange will primarily use the existing right of way with limited additional impacts anticipated. Depending on the final design, wetland impacts are anticipated to be between four and eight acres. Negative impacts to local communities are not anticipated other than temporary disturbance during construction.
