### **AUGUST 2021 CALL FOR PROJECTS**

The Coastal Region Metropolitan Planning Organization (CORE MPO) is conducting a competitive project selection process to award expected FY 2023 and FY 2024 Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program Urban Attributable (Z230) funds, provided through the act entitled Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (also known as FAST Act).

- Expected Available Funds:
  - o FY 2021 = \$900,000 (federal portion will be added to FY 2023 and FY 2024)
  - $\circ$  FY 2023 = \$3,178,721 (federal portion)
  - $\circ$  FY 2024 = \$6,030,778 (federal portion)
- Maximum Award Each Year = total federal portion of the fiscal year.
- Minimum Award for a Project = \$200,000 (federal portion)
- At least 20% of the eligible costs of the proposed project must be locally funded. (Previously incurred costs cannot be counted as part of the 20% match for the newly awarded federal funds.)

An applicant may request a minimum of *at least \$200,000 of federal funds*. The federal funding request in this application can represent no more than 80% of the total cost of the applicant's proposal. For example, if an applicant requests \$1,000,000, and provides no more than the required 20% local match, he/she would be submitting a proposal totaling \$1,250,000.

#### Federal Requirements

Applicants should keep in mind that using the STBG funds involves adherence to federal requirements, as applicable, such as the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), prevailing wage rates (Davis-Bacon), Buy America, competitive bidding, and other contracting requirements, regardless of whether the projects are located within the right-of-way of a Federal-aid highway.

 Projects funded through this selection process must be located within the CORE MPO's Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) boundary.

The CORE MPO - administered STBG Urban Attributable funds can only be spent within the MPO's Metropolitan Planning Area which includes all of Chatham County, the portion of Effingham County and Bryan County located within the Savannah Urbanized Area, as well as Richmond Hill.

• Projects, if awarded funds, will be amended into the CORE MPO's FY 2021 – 2024 Transportation Improvement Program (July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2024).

Once the project is programmed in the TIP and the awarded federal funding is authorized in the program year, the funds must be obligated within two years, otherwise the funds will be rescinded for use by other selected priority projects.

Proposal Description Summary

The project is a full depth reclamation project with drainage, utility and safety improvements. Telfair Road serves as a distribution facility for various industries that serve the Georgia Ports Authority. The project includes making Telfair Road a true connector from Louisville Road to Telfair Place and extend the improvements to Chatham Parkway. Improvements would include the relocation of existing utilities, drainage and pavement improvements. Minimal Right of Way is expected on this project. The project would also include safety improvements at railroad grade crossings. The Telfair Road Improvement project is included in the Vision Plan for the CORE MPO and a priority project for Garden City if a Transportation Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax is considered and approved.

Much of the roadway is redeveloped as distribution corridor for businesses that serve the Georgia Ports Authority operations. Most of this is in the form of drayage operations that move containers off the GPA property onto commercial and industrial properties. The project will make improvements through the entire corridor.

The City of Garden City is one of the municipalities most impacted by freight movements from the Georgia Ports Authority. Many of the previous residential/light commercial areas of the jurisdiction have been converted into warehouse or drayage activities. The roads that were built to withstand residential traffic are now seeing over the road freight traffic that is damaging many of these roads. These roads are vital to the traveling public and integral in supporting the Georgia Ports Authority.

The Telfair Road project incorporates improvements to Telfair Road and Telfair Place East. This would provide an alternative connection from Chatham Parkway to Louisville Road. This connection to Louisville Road has become more important with the opening of the new Gate for the Georgia Ports Authority at the I-16 ramp on Louisville Road. Freight traffic is expected to increase due to this new Gate on the Louisville Road and Telfair Place.

The improvements will require some right of way and easement acquisitions that will not be known until preliminary plans are complete. The utilities along the roadway will also require relocation in some areas. Safety improvements to the intersections of Telfair Road/Louisville Road, Telfair Road/Telfair Place East and Telfair Place East/Chatham Parkway will also be part of the project.

Pedestrian and Bicycle facilities will be reviewed as the project development occurs. This route is not on the Non-Motorized Transportation Plan and are not expected to be incorporated into the project due to the heavy freight movements along the corridor.


