#### **AUGUST 2022 CALL FOR PROJECTS**

The Coastal Region Metropolitan Planning Organization (CORE MPO) is conducting a competitive project selection process to award expected FY 2023 - 2027 Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) Program Urban Attributable (Y230) funds, provided through the act entitled Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (Pub. L. 117-58, also known as the "Bipartisan Infrastructure Law" (BIL).

- Expected Available Funds:
  - o FY 2023 = \$9,750,122 (federal portion)
  - $\circ$  FY 2024 = \$6,480,778 (federal portion)
  - o FY 2025 = \$4,000,000 (federal portion)
  - o FY 2026 = \$4,000,000 (federal portion)
  - o FY 2027 = \$4,000,000 (federal portion)
- Maximum Award for a project = available funds for that year (federal portion)
- Minimum Award for a Project = \$200,000 (federal portion)
- At least 20% of the eligible costs of the proposed project must be locally funded.

  (Previously incurred costs cannot be counted as part of the 20% match for the newly awarded federal funds.)

An applicant may request a minimum of *at least \$200,000 of federal funds*. The federal funding request in this application can represent no more than 80% of the total cost of the applicant's proposal. For example, if an applicant requests \$1,000,000, and provides no more than the required 20% local match, he/she would be submitting a proposal totaling \$1,250,000.

#### • Federal Requirements

Applicants should keep in mind that using the STBG funds involves adherence to federal requirements, as applicable, such as the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), prevailing wage rates (Davis-Bacon), Buy America, competitive bidding, and other contracting requirements, regardless of whether the projects are located within the right-of-way of a Federal-aid highway.

• Projects funded through this selection process must be located within the CORE MPO's Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) boundary.

The CORE MPO - administered STBG Urban Attributable funds can only be spent within the MPO's Metropolitan Planning Area which includes all of Chatham County, the portion of Effingham County and Bryan County located within the Savannah Urbanized Area, as well as Richmond Hill.

Projects, if awarded funds in FY 2023 and FY 2024, will be programmed in the CORE MPO's FY 2021 – 2024 Transportation Improvement Program (July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2024). Awarded projects in FY 2024 will be carried over to the FY 2024 – 2027 TIP as well. FY 2025 – 2027 funds will build the prioritized waiting list for projects to be included in the FY 2024 – 2027 TIP (revisit the prioritization during TIP development).



Once the project is programmed in the TIP and the awarded federal funding is authorized in the program year, the funds must be obligated within two years, otherwise the funds will be rescinded for use by other selected priority projects.

Proposal Description Summary

The Garrard Avenue Improvement Project proposes to construct operational and safety improvements for non-motorized and motorized roadway users from Chatham Parkway to Gamble Road, which also includes a portion of Lane Road, approximately 1.2 miles in length. This project will convert Garrard Avenue from a rural, narrow two-lane roadway section with narrow shoulders, open ditches and without any pedestrian accommodations to a new two-lane urban section with sidewalks, potentially on both sides of the road. The project will also include curb and gutter, drainage and water quality improvements. This portion of Garrard Avenue is a densely populated, lower income area with many residents not having vehicles to get to their destinations. Access to bus stops along the corridor will be an important aspect for concept development. A traffic study will be completed to identify potential improvements at intersections. Lighting and traffic calming features will also be considered. This project will be designed with a context sensitive framework to mimimize right of way impacts and maintain the integrity of the local community.

The Garrard Avenue Improvement Project will construct operational and safety improvements for non-motorized and motorized roadway users from Chatham Parkway to Lane Avenue and extending to Gamble Road, approximately 1.2 miles in length. The project will convert Garrard Avenue from a narrow, rural road with ditches and no pedestrian accommodations to a safer, more urban road with a five foot sidewalk and a multi-use path. The project will include curb and gutter, drainage and water quality improvements. Traffic calming measures will also be implemented along the corridor as well as turn lanes and intersection improvements where warranted. Poor pavement conditions and substandard lane widths will also be corrected and street lighting will be added.

This portion of Garrard Avenue is a densely populated, lower income area with many residents without a vehicle to get to their destinations. With the lack of existing ADA compliant pedestrian facilities, it is unsafe for people to walk along the shoulder of the road. The proposed project will address this critical safety issue by providing a more equitable non-motorized transportation system that is ADA compliant. This will increase connectivity by enabling residents to get to bus stops, adjacent commercial areas and employment opportunities in the vicinity. Conflicts between pedestrians and vehicles will be minimized by separating the pedestrians from the motorized travel way, the added connectivity to the local community will provide additional opportunities for our citizens to utilize non-motorized transportation options rather than using their vehicles to get to their destinations, improving the quality of life for all income levels in this community.

This project will be designed with context sensitivity to adjacent properties to minimize right of way impacts as well as any impacts to adjacent wetlands or environmental resources. Sidewalks and paths will meander around large Oak trees, which are an important part of the community.

The Garrard Avenue Improvement Project, PI No. 0017976 is currently in Cost Band One of Mobility 2045 as well as in the current TIP, and is currently in the Preliminary Engineering phase.



#### Garrard Avenue Improvement Project

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Garrard Avenue Improvement Project proposes to construct operational and safety improvements for non-motorized and motorized roadway users from its intersection at Gamble Road to its intersection with Chatham Parkway, approximately 1.2 miles in length. This project will convert Garrard Avenue from a rural, two-lane roadway section without pedestrian improvements to a new two-lane, urban section with 5-foot sidewalks on both sides of the roadway. The project will also install curb and gutter as well as stormwater and water quality improvements. The project will benefit the densely populated, lower income area where many residents do not have vehicles to get to their destinations.

COMMENTS/REMARKS: The project ranked #2 during the 2020 Z301 Call for Projects. Chatham County is the local sponsor. Chatham County was awarded \$280,000 of Z301 funds for preliminary engineering in FY 2021 and \$1,041,114 of Z301 funds for construction in FY 2024. The County will provide the required 20% match plus additional local funds needed. The County is using the local SPLOST funds for the right-of-way phase in FY 2023. The project ranked 3rd in the Z230 Call for Projects and was awarded \$800,000 for the ROW phase programmed in FY 2023 and \$2,958,885 for the CST phase programmed in FY 2024. Chatham County will provide the local match. The County also updated the PE cost estimate in FY 2021. In April 2022 the project was awarded \$230,000 in released Z230 funds for the PE phase in FY 2022, and the County will provide the required match of \$57,500.
