Carbon Reduction Program (Y601) Funds September 2025 Call for Projects

The Coastal Region Metropolitan Planning Organization (CORE MPO) is conducting a competitive project selection process to award expected FY 2026 - 2030 Carbon Reduction Program (Y601) funds, provided through the act entitled Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA, Pub. L. 117-58).

- Expected Available Funds (subject to change, funding after 2026 contingent upon IIJA Continuing Resolution or CRP inclusion in future transportation legislation):
 - FY 2026 = \$1,200,000 (federal portion)
 - FY 2027 = \$0 (federal portion)
 - FY 2028 = \$1,200,000 (federal portion)
 - FY 2029 = \$1,200,000 (federal portion)
 - FY 2030 = \$1,200,000 (federal portion)
- Maximum Award for a project = available funds for that year (federal portion)
- Minimum Award for a Project = \$200,000 (federal portion)
- At least 20% of the eligible costs of the proposed project must be locally funded. (Previously incurred costs cannot be counted as part of the 20% match for the newly awarded federal funds.)


An applicant may request a minimum of *at least \$200,000 of federal funds.* The federal funding request in this application can represent no more than 80% of the total cost of the applicant's proposal. For example, if an applicant requests \$1,000,000, and provides no more than the required 20% local match, he/she would be submitting a proposal totaling \$1,250,000.

Federal Requirements

Applicants should keep in mind that using the CRP funds involves adherence to federal requirements, as applicable, such as the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), prevailing wage rates (Davis-Bacon), Buy America, competitive bidding, and other contracting requirements, regardless of whether the projects are located within the right-of-way of a Federal-aid highway.

 Projects funded through this selection process must be located within the CORE MPO's Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) boundary.

The CORE MPO - administered CRP funds can only be spent within the MPO's Metropolitan Planning Area which includes all of Chatham County and portions of Effingham County and Bryan County (see map on the next page).

Projects, if awarded funds in FY 2026 and FY 2027, will be programmed in the CORE MPO's FY 2024 – 2027 Transportation Improvement Program. Awarded projects in FY 2027 will be carried over to the FY 2027 – 2030 TIP as well. FY 2028 – 2030 funds will build the prioritized waiting list for projects to be included in the FY 2027 – 2030 TIP (revisit the prioritization during TIP development).

Once the project is programmed in the TIP and the awarded federal funding is authorized in the program year, the funds must be obligated within two years, otherwise the funds will be rescinded for use by other selected priority projects.

This project proposes to design and construct a new multi-use trail segment within Effingham County as part of the larger Georgia Hi-Lo Trail, a 211 mile regional trail network that will ultimately connect Savannah to Athens. The Effingham County segment will extend approximately 10.8 miles through the Ebenezer Creek and Atlas Park area, linking planned trailheads, recreational areas, and community facilities while connecting to future extensions in Screven County to the north and Chatham County to the south.

Proposal Description Summary

The Georgia Hi-Lo Trail Connector, Effingham County Segment will provide a 10.8-mile, 12-foot-wide paved multi-use path designed for pedestrians, cyclists, and other non-motorized users. The corridor will connect key natural, recreational, and cultural destinations such as Ebenezer Creek, Atlas Park, and surrounding neighborhoods.

This project represents a major investment in regional trail connectivity, supporting recreation, tourism, and alternative transportation options across multiple counties. The trail will meet ADA standards, include stabilized shoulders, drainage and grading improvements, and trailhead amenities such as signage, seating, and wayfinding markers.

The Effingham County segment will serve as a critical link between existing and planned trail networks under the Georgia Hi-Lo Trail master plan. It will also tie into local trail and sidewalk systems identified in the Effingham County Transportation Master Plan (2025) and the County's Non-Motorized Transportation Plan.

The Georgia Hi-Lo Trail Connector – Effingham County Segment will serve as a cornerstone of regional mobility, recreation, and economic development. This 10.8-mile multi-use trail will expand access to outdoor recreation, provide a safe and sustainable transportation option for residents, and connect Effingham County to a statewide trail network linking Savannah to Athens.

The project will create a continuous, ADA-compliant, 12-foot-wide trail that accommodates pedestrians, cyclists, and families while preserving the scenic and environmental value of the Ebenezer Creek and Atlas Park corridor. The new segment will provide safe, non-motorized access between neighborhoods, recreation areas, and regional destinations, eliminating pedestrian—vehicle conflicts along rural roadways and providing residents with a viable alternative to vehicle travel for short trips.

The Georgia Hi-Lo Trail will also serve as a major tourism and economic catalyst, supporting Effingham County's goals for recreation-based economic development. By connecting parks, waterways, and cultural landmarks, the project will attract visitors, support local small businesses, and strengthen the region's outdoor recreation economy.

Environmental sustainability and community sensitivity are central to the design. The trail alignment will follow existing public rights-of-way and natural contours to minimize grading and impacts to wetlands and tree cover. Drainage improvements and vegetative buffers will be integrated to manage stormwater and protect water quality.

This project advances the Effingham County Transportation Master Plan (2025) goals for multimodal connectivity and regional cooperation and directly supports the CORE MPO's regional priorities for alternative transportation and safety. It also aligns with the intent of the Justice40 initiative by investing in equitable, accessible infrastructure that benefits residents across income levels.

Once complete, the Effingham County Roads Division will maintain the trail, ensuring long-term sustainability and community benefit. The project will connect local residents and visitors alike to nature, recreation, and economic opportunity, helping position Effingham County as a key link in Georgia's statewide trail system.
