# Carbon Reduction Program (Y601) Funds September 2025 Call for Projects

The Coastal Region Metropolitan Planning Organization (CORE MPO) is conducting a competitive project selection process to award expected FY 2026 - 2030 Carbon Reduction Program (Y601) funds, provided through the act entitled Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA, Pub. L. 117-58).

- Expected Available Funds (subject to change, funding after 2026 contingent upon IIJA Continuing Resolution or CRP inclusion in future transportation legislation):
  - FY 2026 = \$1,200,000 (federal portion)
  - FY 2027 = \$0 (federal portion)
  - FY 2028 = \$1,200,000 (federal portion)
  - FY 2029 = \$1,200,000 (federal portion)
  - FY 2030 = \$1,200,000 (federal portion)
- Maximum Award for a project = available funds for that year (federal portion)
- Minimum Award for a Project = \$200,000 (federal portion)
- At least 20% of the eligible costs of the proposed project must be locally funded. (Previously incurred costs cannot be counted as part of the 20% match for the newly awarded federal funds.)


An applicant may request a minimum of *at least \$200,000 of federal funds.* The federal funding request in this application can represent no more than 80% of the total cost of the applicant's proposal. For example, if an applicant requests \$1,000,000, and provides no more than the required 20% local match, he/she would be submitting a proposal totaling \$1,250,000.

#### Federal Requirements

Applicants should keep in mind that using the CRP funds involves adherence to federal requirements, as applicable, such as the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), prevailing wage rates (Davis-Bacon), Buy America, competitive bidding, and other contracting requirements, regardless of whether the projects are located within the right-of-way of a Federal-aid highway.

 Projects funded through this selection process must be located within the CORE MPO's Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) boundary.

The CORE MPO - administered CRP funds can only be spent within the MPO's Metropolitan Planning Area which includes all of Chatham County and portions of Effingham County and Bryan County (see map on the next page).



#### CORE MPO Metropolitan Planning Area as approved by the Governor of Georgia in 2024

Projects, if awarded funds in FY 2026 and FY 2027, will be programmed in the CORE MPO's FY 2024 – 2027 Transportation Improvement Program. Awarded projects in FY 2027 will be carried over to the FY 2027 – 2030 TIP as well. FY 2028 – 2030 funds will build the prioritized waiting list for projects to be included in the FY 2027 – 2030 TIP (revisit the prioritization during TIP development).

Once the project is programmed in the TIP and the awarded federal funding is authorized in the program year, the funds must be obligated within two years, otherwise the funds will be rescinded for use by other selected priority projects.

The proposed project corridor extends along Kolic Helmey Road from Hodgeville Road to Blue Jay Road, in		
Effingham County, Georgia. This east–west connector links several residential neighborhoods, schools, and		
commercial areas while also serving as a key access route to the new Hodgeville Road roundabout. Currently,		
Kolic Helmey Road is a narrow two-lane roadway with open ditches, minimal shoulders, and no sidewalks or		
bicycle facilities.

#### **Proposal Description Summary**

The Kolic Helmey Road Multi-Use Trail Project will enhance safety and accessibility for both motorized and non-motorized users along approximately 2.3 miles of the corridor between Hodgeville Road and Blue Jay Road. The project will reconstruct the existing roadway with curb and gutter, a five-foot sidewalk, and a ten-foot multi-use trail, providing ADA-compliant and separated facilities for pedestrians and cyclists.

In addition to the trail and sidewalk improvements, the project will include drainage and water-quality upgrades, shoulder stabilization, intersection enhancements, and turn lanes where warranted. These improvements will address poor pavement conditions, improve stormwater control, and create a safer, more efficient roadway for all users.

The corridor connects to multiple subdivisions, recreation facilities, and schools, and will serve as a vital extension of the pedestrian network being developed along Hodgeville and Blue Jay Roads.

The Kolic Helmey Road Multi-Use Trail Project will deliver major safety and connectivity improvements for both vehicles and non-motorized users in one of Effingham County's fastest-growing areas. This corridor connects several large residential subdivisions to Blue Jay Road, Hodgeville Road, and nearby schools and recreation facilities. With no sidewalks or bike lanes, pedestrians and cyclists currently must use the roadway shoulders, creating hazardous conditions along a route with increasing traffic volumes.

The proposed project will reconstruct Kolic Helmey Road into a complete street, providing curb and gutter, a five-foot sidewalk, and a ten-foot multi-use trail to safely separate pedestrians and cyclists from vehicular traffic. ADA-compliant crossings and turn-lane enhancements will improve access and reduce crash risk. Drainage and water-quality improvements will address frequent runoff and erosion issues, protecting both the roadway and adjacent properties.

The project's location near the Hodgeville Road roundabout and Blue Jay Road corridor makes it a vital link in Effingham County's emerging pedestrian and bicycle network. By connecting these corridors, the multi-use trail will enable safe, non-motorized access between neighborhoods, parks, and schools, encouraging walking and cycling as practical travel modes.

The project also supports economic and operational efficiency by improving stormwater control, reducing long-term maintenance costs, and extending pavement life. Improved roadway design will enhance mobility and provide safer turning and access points for residents and local traffic. Environmental and community sensitivity will guide the design process. Sidewalks and the multi-use trail will be aligned to minimize right-of-way impacts and preserve mature trees and existing vegetation where feasible. The corridor's rural residential character will be maintained through careful grading and the use of natural drainage channels where appropriate.

The Kolic Helmey Road Multi-Use Trail Project aligns directly with the Effingham County Transportation Master Plan (2025) and CORE MPO's regional goals for multimodal safety, connectivity, and equitable access. It also advances the intent of the Justice40 initiative by providing infrastructure investment in a mixed-income area where safe, non-motorized transportation options are limited. Once completed, the facility will be maintained by the Effingham County Roads Division, ensuring long-term benefit and sustainability.

Overall, this project will reduce pedestrian risk, improve roadway performance, and strengthen multimodal connections and enhancing quality of life for residents while supporting safe, efficient, and accessible transportation throughout southern Effingham County.


