## Transportation Alternatives (Y301) Funds

### September 2025 Call for Projects

The Coastal Region Metropolitan Planning Organization (CORE MPO) is conducting a competitive project selection process to award expected FY 2026 - 2030 Transportation Alternatives (TA) Y301 funds, provided through the act entitled Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA, Pub. L. 117-58).

- Expected Available Funds:
  - FY 2026 = \$1,248,676 (federal portion)
  - FY 2027 = \$1,414,111 (federal portion)
  - o FY 2028 = \$1,414,111 (federal portion)
  - FY 2029 = \$1,414,111 (federal portion)
  - FY 2030 = \$1,414,111 (federal portion)
- Maximum Award for a project = available funds for that year (federal portion)
- Minimum Award for a Project = \$200,000 (federal portion)
- At least 20% of the eligible costs of the proposed project must be locally funded.
   (Previously incurred costs cannot be counted as part of the 20% match for the newly awarded federal funds.)


An applicant may request a minimum of *at least \$200,000 of federal funds.* The federal funding request in this application can represent no more than 80% of the total cost of the applicant's proposal. For example, if an applicant requests \$1,000,000, and provides no more than the required 20% local match, he/she would be submitting a proposal totaling \$1,250,000.

#### Federal Requirements

Applicants should keep in mind that using the TA funds involves adherence to federal requirements, as applicable, such as the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), prevailing wage rates (Davis-Bacon), Buy America, competitive bidding, and other contracting requirements, regardless of whether the projects are located within the right-of-way of a Federal-aid highway.

 Projects funded through this selection process must be located within the CORE MPO's Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) boundary.

The CORE MPO - administered TA funds can only be spent within the MPO's Metropolitan Planning Area which includes all of Chatham County and portions of Effingham County and Bryan County (see map on the next page).

Projects, if awarded funds in FY 2026 and FY 2027, will be programmed in the CORE MPO's FY 2024 – 2027 Transportation Improvement Program. Awarded projects in FY 2027 will be carried over to the FY 2027 – 2030 TIP as well. FY 2028 – 2030 funds will build the prioritized waiting list for projects to be included in the FY 2027 – 2030 TIP (revisit the prioritization during TIP development).

Once the project is programmed in the TIP and the awarded federal funding is authorized in the program year, the funds must be obligated within two years, otherwise the funds will be rescinded for use by other selected priority projects.

#### **Project Overview**

McCall Road Multi-Use Trail

The project extends along McCall Road from Blue Jay Road to Hodgeville Road, covering approximately 5.8 miles in unincorporated southern Effingham County. This east—west connector serves several residential neighborhoods and is a critical link between Blue Jay Road and the Hodgeville corridor. The existing two-lane roadway lacks curb and gutter, has narrow shoulders, and provides no pedestrian or bicycle facilities.

#### **Proposal Description Summary**

The McCall Road Multi-Use Trail Project will add a ten-foot multi-use trail and a five-foot sidewalk along both sides of the corridor to provide safe, ADA-compliant access for pedestrians and cyclists. The project will reconstruct the existing two-lane roadway with curb and gutter, drainage upgrades, and intersection improvements at Blue Jay Road and Hodgeville Road.

This project will connect directly to other planned multimodal corridors—including Blue Jay Road, Hodgeville Road, and Kolic Helmey Road—forming a continuous network of safe, non-motorized infrastructure across southern Effingham County. These improvements will also support local access to nearby schools, neighborhoods, and employment areas while reducing pedestrian—vehicle conflict points.

The McCall Road Multi-Use Trail Project will significantly improve safety and mobility for residents and commuters traveling between Blue Jay Road and Hodgeville Road, two of Effingham County's busiest growth corridors. The roadway currently lacks sidewalks and shoulders, creating unsafe conditions for pedestrians and cyclists who must share travel lanes with vehicles.

This project will reconstruct McCall Road as a complete street, providing a ten-foot multi-use trail, a five-foot sidewalk, and curb and gutter to separate non-motorized users from vehicle traffic. Drainage and stormwater upgrades will reduce flooding and improve roadway durability, while turn-lane and intersection enhancements will increase operational safety.

The project supports multimodal connectivity by linking three other major County corridors: Blue Jay Road, Hodgeville Road, and Kolic Helmey Road. This network will allow residents to travel safely between neighborhoods, schools, and job centers without depending solely on personal vehicles. By investing in equitable, ADA-compliant pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure, Effingham County is improving quality of life for residents while advancing the goals of the Effingham County Transportation Master Plan (2025), the CORE MPO's regional objectives, and the Justice40 initiative.

Design will follow context-sensitive principles, preserving vegetation, minimizing ROW needs, and respecting adjacent property character. Once completed, the facility will be maintained by the Effingham County Roads Division, ensuring long-term safety, access, and connectivity.
