AGENDA ITEM: Updates to FY 2021 – 2024 Transportation Improvement Program

PRESENTER: Alicia Hunter, MPO Staff

SUMMARY: The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is the MPO's short-

> range programming document and is a staged, multi-year listing of surface transportation projects proposed for federal, state, and local funding within the metropolitan area. The TIP may be modified in accordance with the procedures outlined in the adopted Participation Plan by resolution of the CORE MPO Board if priorities, area goals,

project schedules or funding levels change.

The current FY 2021 – 2024 TIP was adopted by the CORE MPO Board in December 2020 and is referenced in the Statewide TIP (STIP) which was signed by the Governor of Georgia in May 2021.

In May 2021, the Chatham Area Transit Authority (CAT) provided some transit updates that need to be incorporated. The Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) has also sent the confirmation letter to move funds for the right-of-way phase of Project DeRenne. The City of Savannah requested some schedule changes to the DeRenne projects as well. It is important to incorporate these updates and make sure that the information contained in the FY 2021 – 2024 TIP is current and reflective of the most up-to-date revenue projections, cost estimates and development schedules.

If a new project/phase is being programmed or a project/phase has an updated cost estimate or schedule, administrative modifications or TIP amendments are needed to reflect the current project development status. The following summary outlines the changes to the FY 2021 -2024 TIP.

Recommendation: For endorsement and approval of proposed TIP updates.

AMENDMENT PROCESS FOR FY 2021 – FY 2024 TIP

It should be noted that the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) must be consistent with the current 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) called Mobility 2045. Before amendments can be made to the FY 2021 - 2024 TIP, MTP/TIP consistency must be verified. The TIP must also be conformant to the Performance Based Planning and Programming (PBPP).

The proposed project updates (outlined on the next pages) are requested by GDOT, CAT and the City of Savannah for June 2021. Updated TIP project pages/tables for the proposed highway and transit projects are illustrated in Appendix A. Projects/Phases requiring amendments, as opposed to administrative modification, to the TIP require a 15-day public review and comment period.

Public Participation Process

The adopted TIP/STIP amendment process outlined in the CORE MPO's Participation Plan requires public review and comment and responses to all comments (either individually or in summary form) for all TIP amendments. To process the proposed updates in June 2021, CORE MPO advertised a fifteen (15) day public comment period in the Savannah Morning News on Sunday, June 6, 2021 (Appendix B). The notice was sent to the local news media and the consultation agencies as well as neighborhood associations and posted on the CORE MPO website. The comment period starts on June 9, 2021 and closes on June 23, 2021. A virtual public hearing has been advertised – it will be held in conjunction with the virtual CORE MPO Board meeting on June 23, 2021.
