Resolution to Amend the FY 2015 – 2018 Transportation Improvement Program of the Coastal Region Metropolitan Planning Organization (CORE MPO)

WHEREAS, the Coastal Region Metropolitan Planning Organization (CORE MPO) desires to adopt an amendment to the FY 2015 - 2018 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the CORE MPO transportation planning area; and

WHEREAS, the proposed TIP amendment is to program an additional preliminary engineering (PE) phase in FY 2017 for PI# 0012757, I-16 Widening from I-95 to I-516; and

WHEREAS, CORE MPO has completed a 15-day public review and comment period for the proposed TIP amendment according to the Participation Plan and incorporated all received comments; and

WHEREAS, CORE MPO would like to complete the TIP amendment process to incorporate the project programming updates.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Coastal Region Metropolitan Planning Organization approves the proposed amendment to the FY 2015 - 2018 Transportation Improvement Program as shown in the summary of TIP amendment report with any corrections based upon the motion of December 14, 2016.

Amendment to FY 2015 - 2018 Transportation Improvement Program of the Coastal Region Metropolitan Planning Organization (CORE MPO)

December 2016

The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is the MPO's short-range programming document and is a staged, multi-year listing of surface transportation projects proposed for federal, state and local funding within the metropolitan area. The TIP may be modified in accordance with the procedures outlined in the adopted Participation Plan by resolution of the CORE MPO Board if priorities, area goals, project schedules or funding levels change. The CORE MPO's current FY 2015 - 2018 TIP was adopted by the MPO Board in August 2014. A series of administrative modifications and amendments have been processed for various projects since the adoption of the TIP.

In November 2016 CORE MPO received a request from the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) to amend the FY 2015 - 2018 TIP to add an additional preliminary engineering (PE) phase in FY 2017 for I-16 Widening from I-95 to I-516.

The Transportation Improvement Program must be consistent with the current 2040 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP). The I-16 Widening project is currently listed in Cost Band One of the 2040 MTP. As required by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), an addendum to the 2040 MTP was developed to document the consistency as a part of the December 2016 TIP amendment.

The TIP financial plan must be balanced, meaning the project costs must be less than or equal to projected revenues. For state and federally funded projects not using urban attributable funds (code Z230), the GDOT Office of Financial Management (OFM) makes a determination of fiscal constraint prior to authorizing funds. The requested TIP amendment was processed subject to GDOT providing additional federal and state funds in FY 2017 to cover costs of the I-16 Widening project, thus not negatively impacting other projects programmed in FY 2017.

According to the STIP/TIP amendment process outlined in the Participation Plan, the TIP amendment process requires public advertisement, a 15-day comment period and response to all comments, either individually or in a summary form. There is no requirement for a public hearing. The amendment follows the usual MPO Committee process for action.

In order to process the proposed TIP amendment, CORE MPO advertised a public comment period in the Savannah Morning News on Sunday, November 27, 2016. The notice was also sent to the local news media and the consultation agencies as well as neighborhood associations, and was posted on the CORE MPO website. The public comment period started on November 29, 2016 and closed on December 13, 2016. A public hearing for the proposed TIP amendment was held in conjunction with the December 2016 CORE MPO Board meeting. All of the MPO's advisory committees endorsed the proposed TIP amendment at their respective December 2016 meetings and the MPO Board approved the amendment on December 14, 2017.

The following summarizes the proposed TIP amendment.

I-16 Widening from I-95 to I-516

- **PI** #: 0012757
- **MTP Priority:** Based on the March 2016 amendment made to the CORE MPO's 2040 Total Mobility Plan, the PE and CST phases of this project were incorporated into Cost Band One of the 2040 MTP in order to make the project eligible for inclusion in the TIP.
- Project description: Based on the GDOT Interstate Needs Study for Chatham County that was developed in 2008, this project would add an additional lane in each direction on I-16 between I-95 and I-516. The widening would occur on the inside of the eastbound and westbound lanes. The one overpass on this section of I-16 was constructed with enough width to accommodate an additional lane in each direction to the inside of the existing lanes, thus the future widening would occur to the inside. Since all widening would occur to the inside, a barrier wall would be required to safely separate eastbound and westbound traffic.

However, the detailed scope of work for the widening project is still being developed by GDOT in conjunction with the I-95/I-16 Interchange Reconstruction project. Currently this is a Design/Build project, and the project description will not be finalized until GDOT has an approved concept report.

- **Project Status:** Currently the PE phase and the CST phase are programmed in the TIP in FY 2016 and FY 2018 respectively.
- Amendment: GDOT is proposing to add an additional PE phase in FY 2017.
- Reason for Amendment: Adding a project or a phase of a project to the TIP is considered an amendment.
- Funding/Year:
 - Z001 funds in the amount of \$9,100,00 are to be programmed in FY 2017 for the PE phase with 80/20 federal/state split - \$7,280,000 federal / \$1,820,000 state.


