[1. Petition of Russell Finland | 26-000090 COA | 409 E Hall Street | Replace decking](#)

Jodie Brown prepared the Staff report regarding the applicant's requested proposal to replace to the deck boards at the front porch of the house. Constructed mid-block on the south side of Hall Street, the house is located in the Stephens Ward. The house was constructed in 1892 and designed as a duplex. It is one of three similar duplexes that line the street. It was designed in the Colonial Revival style with a hipped roof and a centrally located dormer. The exterior is sheathed with rusticated block. The front façade features a full-width porch supported by Tuscan columns and an upper uncovered deck. Fenestration consists of a wood and glass main entrance with a transom, diamond patterned French doors and 2/2 double hung windows.

The subject building is listed as a contributing resource within the National Historic Landmark District and the local Savannah Downtown Historic District.

Staff recommended to APPROVE the request to replace the deck boards on the front porch

in-kind on the property at 409 East Hall Street AS REQUESTED because the work is visually compatible and meets the Standards.

[2. Petition of Studio Mc+G Architecture, Jennifer McConney-Gayoso | 26-000713-COA | 2-14 E Bryan Street | Enclosure](#)

Jodie Brown prepared the Staff report regarding the applicant's proposal to construct an enclosure for an electrical vault to house transformers on the north side of 14 E Bryan Street. Located on the north side of Johnson Square within the Derby Ward, there are two high-rise properties. At the northeast corner is the Savannah Bank and Trust which was considered one of the city's earliest high-rises. Designed in the Neo-Classical style, the building was constructed in 1911. Designed in tripartite composition, the building features a 4-story marble base, an unadorned middle section and upper floors clad in glazed white terra cotta. The main entrance to the building is off of Bull Street and is announced with two, 3-story Corinthian columns flanking the door. This building is listed as a contributing resource to the National Historic Landmark District and the local Savannah Downtown Historic District. Immediately to the east of the Savannah Bank and Trust is an International style 10-story building that was constructed ca. 1976. This building is listed as a non-contributing resource to the National Historic Landmark District and the local Savannah Downtown Historic District.

Staff recommended to APPROVE the request for a rear façade enclosure on the property at 2-14 East Bryan Street AS REQUESTED because the work is visually compatible and meets the Standards.

[4. Petition of Michael Roach, Coastal Contracting | 26-000064-COA | 301 East Huntingdon Street | Window Replacements](#)

Alexander Merced prepared the applicant's request to replace 13 windows. The building was constructed in the 1980's and is a non-contributing resource within the National Historic

Landmark District and the local Savannah Downtown Historic District. It sits on the corner of E Huntingdon Street and Lincoln Street and is bordered on the East and South by non-contributing rowhouse structures. Contributing structures lie across both Huntingdon and Lincoln Streets.

Staff recommended to approve the window replacements at 301 East Huntingdon Street as requested because much of the existing non-contributing building is already non-conforming, therefore in-kind replacements are reasonable.

[5. Petition of Signs of the South | 26-000723-COA | 31 West Congress Street | Non-Illuminated Sign, Color Change, Awnings](#)

**This petition was heard on the Regular Agenda, due to Board member questions.

Alexander Merced prepared the Staff report regarding the applicant's request to change the exterior paint color, reupholster and change the color of the three awnings, and install signage, including a non-illuminated wall sign, translucent window stripes, and an entry door logo. The building was constructed in 1851 and is a contributing resource within the National Historic Landmark District and the local Savannah Downtown Historic District. The address is part of a three-story commercial building at the corner of Congress and Whitaker with storefronts that wrap around the ground floor on both streets. It sits across Congress from the parking lot and drive-thru ATM of a contributing bank building, and next door to a non-contributing commercial building.

Staff recommended to approve the work proposed for 31 West Congress Street as requested because it is visually compatible and meets the standards.

[7. Petition of Sottile & Sottile, LLC, Craig Clements | 26-000712-COA | 3 West Gordon Street | Rehabilitation & Alterations](#)

Caitlin Chamberlain prepared the report regarding the applicant's request of approval for rehabilitation and alterations for the historic property located at 3 West Gordon Street.

Scope of work includes:

- Roof replacement Inclusion of skylights not visible from public right of way
- Repairs to brick masonry and stucco
- Repairs to historic ironwork
- Window and door repair/replacement Restoration of a historic window on west elevation, 3rd floor
Converting an existing window to a door on third story rear porch
Restoring a door that existed historically on second story rear porch
- Repairs to historic garden wall and fences
- Remove corrosion and repaint fire escape

3 West Gordon Street, The Noble Hardee Mansion, was built in 1860/1884 and is a contributing resource within the National Historic Landmark District and the local Savannah Downtown Historic District. The house sits on the corner of Bull and Gordon Streets and faces Monterey Square. Construction of the house began in 1860 by Noble Hardee, but he did not live to see its completion in 1869. Originally designed as a double house in the Italianate style, the structure underwent a large-scale renovation in 1884.

Staff recommended to approve the proposed rehabilitation and alterations for the property located at 3 West Perry Street as requested because the work is visually compatible and meets the standards.

Jodie Brown presented the applicant's request of approval for the removal of existing small cell equipment and subsequent installation of proposed updated small cell equipment. The applicant submitted requests for 36 applications to review existing upgrades. Of the 36 only 4 of them are not located within the public right-of-way (ROW) plus one pole that is not owned by the City of Savannah. All the cell towers will be reviewed under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act. The 4 cell towers that are not located within the ROW including the pole not owned by the city will be reviewed for a COA while the remaining 36 cell towers within the ROW are not within the purview of the HDBR.

- 111 Barnard Street, pole

Staff recommended to APPROVE the request to replace the cell tower equipment for the properties located at 621 Drayton Street, 1 West River Street, 200 West Congress Street, 110 East State Street, and 111 Barnard Street AS REQUESTED because the work is visually compatible and meets the Standards.

[14. Petition of Homestead Architecture, Pete Callejas | 26-000715-COA | 317 East Jones Street | Rear Addition](#)

Caitlin Chamberlain presented the applicant's request of approval to install an addition at the rear of the building located at 317 East Jones Street. The proposed addition would be attached to an existing non-historic addition. The request also includes the installation of two new doors on the front elevation as well as a color

change for the front portico and window trim.

317 East Jones Street was built in 1868 and is a contributing resource within the National Historic Landmark District and the local Savannah Downtown Historic District. It is on the left end of three attached brick rowhomes, or on the right end when looking from the lane where the addition is proposed. All three of the houses have been altered on the rear elevation over time, which is evidenced by the Sanborn Maps. The 1888 map shows a one-story wood porch on the rear. By 1898, it is noted as a two-story wood porch (see Staff Research document for maps). The current configuration of the rear elevation is wood lap siding infill on the former porches, creating interior spaces. The rear elevations of the two connecting properties have been altered further in the last 20 years, based on COA records.

Staff recommended to approve the request to install an addition, install new front doors, and the color change for the front portico and window trim, at 317 East Jones Street with the following condition to be submitted to staff for review and approval, because the work is otherwise visually compatible and meets the standards:

1. Select an approved door type on the addition to replace the proposed sliding glass doors.
