#### 8. FY 2015 – 2018 Transportation Improvement Program Updates

Ms. Wykoda Wang, with CORE MPO, explained that because of the funding changes resulting from the FAST Act (the new federal transportation legislation) and HB 170 (the State of Georgia transportation bill), the state DOT would be unable to provide the MPO with the revenue projections for the development and adoption of a new FY 2017 – 2020 TIP by June 30, 2016. Thus the current FY 2015 – 2018 TIP remains the CORE MPO's guiding programming document.

However, she noted that there are some changes proposed, largely shifting certain projects' phases from FY 2016 to future years if they won't be authorized by June 30, because the state's fiscal year is about to roll over into FY 2017 on July 1. There are also some changes for cost estimates and for adding project phases: Truman Linear Park Trail is proposed to be split into two geographic segments, now that the revised concept is approved, with a cost increase for the southern portion; funding would be removed from the Sector 13 Studies; on the culvert replacements at SR 25 and Pipemaker's Canal a PE phase would be added; a construction phase would be added in FY 2017 for Islands Expressway Bridge Replacement; a PE phase would be added for the I-95 at I-16 interchange reconstruction; utility and construction phases would be added for the SR 144 widening; the Section 5307 Passenger Ferry program would be updated to reflect CAT's recent grant award; the Congestion Management Process update would be removed from the TIP because it now has discretionary Highway Planning funds which are reflected in the Unified Planning Work Program instead of the TIP.

The Chairman opened the public meeting.

There were no comments from the public.

There was some discussion between Board and staff about reasons Truman Linear Park Trail has taken many years to get going, and suggestions that the restraining cables in median of I-16 should be extended farther to the west, given that five people were killed that morning when a vehicle crossed the median.

#### 9. Congestion Management Process Report Card

Mr. Mark Wilkes, with CORE MPO, stated the CMP report card is responsive to the Federal Highway Administration's recommendation for reviewing current and projected



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congestion in comparison to the baseline of the 2003/2004 CMP. It evaluates the effectiveness of completed congestion mitigation measures since the initial CMP. It forecasts future congestion, which informs the MTP and TIP.

He noted that the prior data showed that congestion in many cases was on segments where improvements were already planned. He concluded that 90% of the congested segments have been addressed.

#### 10. Montgomery Street Two-Way Traffic Study Final Report

Mr. Wilkes stated the study focused on the feasibility of returning two-way traffic to Montgomery Street between Oglethorpe and Broughton Street to improve the circulation for the planned Cultural Arts Center. Two alternatives have been identified. Alternative 1, with two northbound lanes, one southbound lane, and less parking retained has about the same level of service for the streets in the area as the current configuration -- except for the intersection of Montgomery St. and Oglethorpe Ave. in the year 2037. Alternative 2, with one travel lane each direction, but more parking preserved, has slightly lower level of service on the area streets for most analysis periods.

The analysis takes the I-16 ramp as is because the Cultural Arts Center is expected to happen quite soon, before any potential ramp removal could occur.

This study provides assistance to the decision-makers, but no recommendation for which alternative.
